Etosha Safari

Itinerary of the 4 – day safari to the Etosha National Park

Day 01:

The Safari starts after breakfast and we collect you from your hotel in Swakopmund. We proceed via Usakos and Omaruru directly to the Etosha Pan. This National Park is worldwide known for its rich game life. Species like Oryx, Kudu, Springbok, Zebra, Giraffe and many more can be seen while we do game drives. The first recorded descriptions of Etosha were by the travelers Francis Galton and Charles Andersson, who camped near what is now Namutoni in 1851.

Andersson described the pan as "... covered with saline incrustations, and having wooded and well-defined borders. The surface consisted of a soft, greenish-yellow, clay soil, strewn with fragments of small sand-stone, of a purple tint." Etosha was the first park to be proclaimed in what is now Namibia and unbeknown to many visitors the park boundaries have undergone several changes. Today the park covers an area of 22 270 km².

Overnight at the Rest Camp of Okaukuejo, this offers besides a refreshing swimming pool, a floodlit waterhole. Elephant, Rhinoceros and Lion are regular night visitors.

Day 02:

Game drives in the Etosha National Park, visiting the waterholes for game-viewing and bird- watching. Overnight at a resort in the park or lodge outside the park (Depending on availability)

Day 03:

Game drives. The colorful world of small and large birds is fascinating. Overnight at a resort in the park or lodge outside the park (Depending on availability)

Day 04:

We drive via Outjo and Omaruru to Swakopmund where the Safari ends during the afternoon.
